

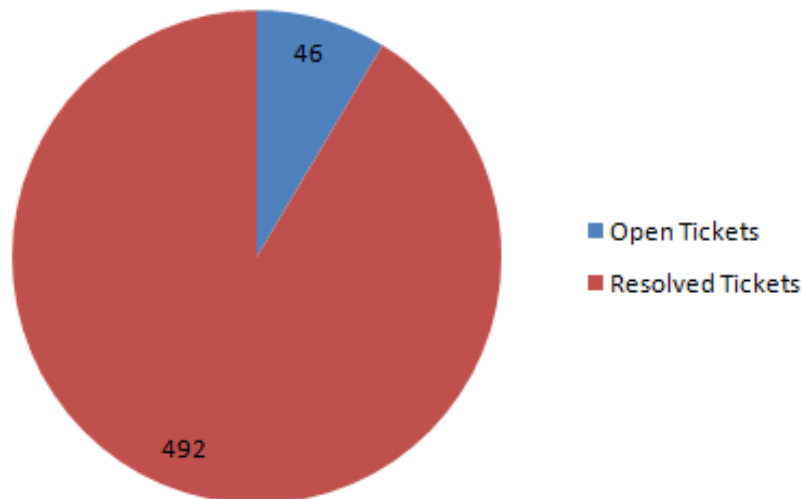
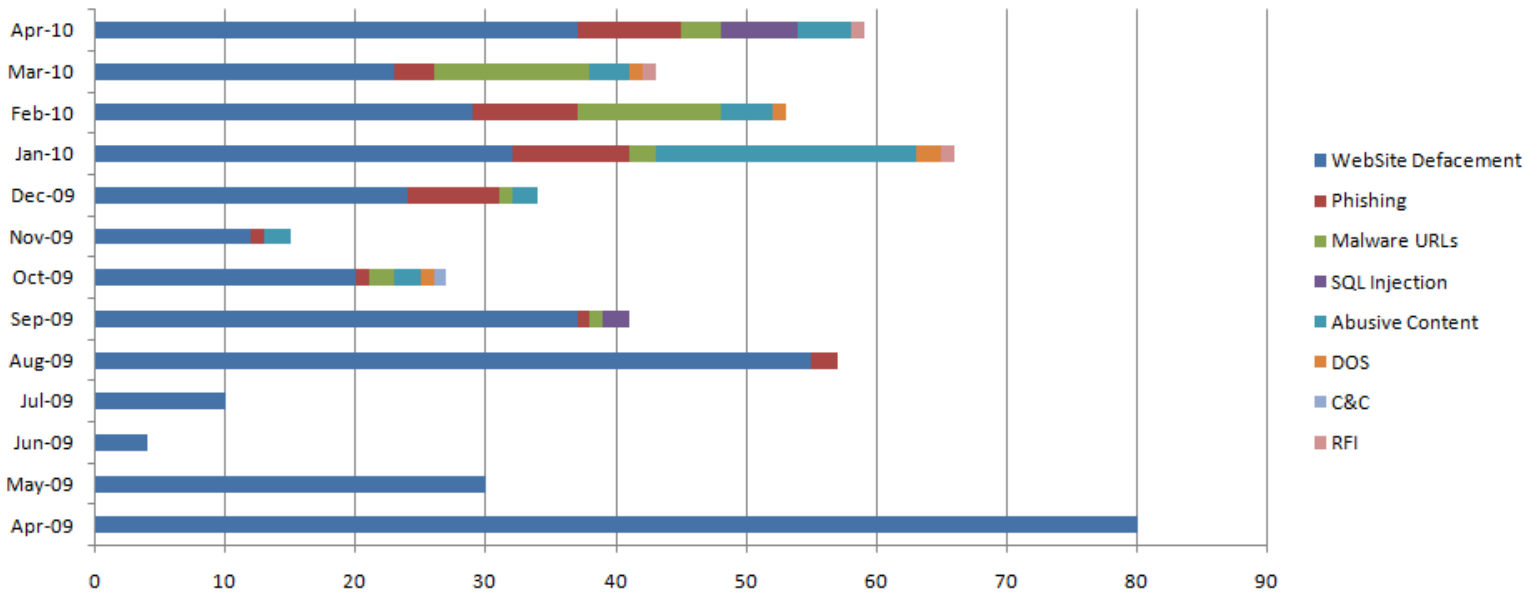
EG-CERT Annual Report

About-US:

EG-CERT is charged with providing computer and information security incident response, support, defence and analysis against cyber attacks and collaboration with government, financial entities and any other critical information infrastructure sectors scoped to Egypt and our mission is to provide an early warning system against malware spreading and massive attacks against the Egyptian critical information infrastructure.

Phish Phry case (co-operation between EG-CERT & American Federal Bureau of Investigations FBI).

Type of Incident: Phishing attacks on international banks.

Incident Description:

- Phish Phry Is a cybercrime investigation carried out by the Egyptian CERT, United States Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and the Los Angeles Electronic Crimes Task Force.
- It considered the largest cybercrime investigation ever carried out, with the largest number of defendants ever charged for the same cybercrime, according to the FBI, nearly 50 individuals in California, Nevada, and North Carolina, and nearly 50 Egyptian citizens have been charged with crimes including computer fraud, conspiracy to commit bank fraud, money laundering, and aggravated identify theft.
- The defendants targeted U.S. banks and deceived thousands of accounts holders and steal their financial information and credentials and used it to transfer nearly \$1.5m to accounts of their own.

Actions Taken by EG-CERT:

- Conduct a forensic analysis on the evidences collected from the Egyptian defendants.
- Prepare a report of the results of the forensics analysis process.
- Presenting the analysis process to the low court.
